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Vandals on tagging frenzy

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GRAFFITI vandals went on a spraying and tagging frenzy at Crescent Head on Tuesday and Wednesday night.

The village woke to find graffiti on cars, roads, street signs and the surf club walls.

Ev Jacobs from the Kempsey-Crescent Head Surf Club said news of the recent graffiti attacks made her sick.

"We spend all of our funds on fixing the club house after vandal and graffiti attacks," Mrs Jacobs said.

"One summer the club had to replace four sets of windows after they were smashed. The windows cost \$700 a set."

Kempsey police said they have received a number of calls from local residents and business owners regarding the graffiti.

As a proactive approach to reducing graffiti within the Shire, council is offering residents and businesses free graffiti kits.

The impact that graffiti has on the community and businesses can be costly. The aim of the graffiti kits is to help local residents and businesses become more informed and provide assistance in removing graffiti.

To receive a graffiti kit residents are required to fill in an application form and attach a photo of the graffiti they wish to remove.

The kits are available at councils Customer First Centre.
